A Look at the University of Portland Site of the 2019 Convention

The University of Portland (UP) is a thriving community of more than 4,000 students from around the nation and the world, as well as over 1,000 faculty and staff. UP is located on a bluff in a residential neighborhood overlooking the Willamette River and the city of Portland.

Rev. Mark L. Poorman, CSC, began his tenure as University of Portland's 20th president in 2014. Since its inception in 1901, UP has been guided by the Congregation of Holy Cross, a Catholic order of priests and brothers. The founder of the order, Blessed Basil Moreau, CSC, said, "The mind will not be cultivated at the expense of the heart." This commitment to educating the hands, heart and mind is a hallmark of UP's belief in educating the whole person.

National Recognition

For 23 consecutive years, UP has earned a top-10 ranking by U.S. News & World Report in the "Regional Universities – West" classification. For six consecutive years, UP has been the top Oregon school in Kiplinger's Personal Finance annual ranking of best values in private universities. And for three consecutive years, Bloomberg Businessweek has named University of Portland the top school in Oregon for "return on investment" in a state-by-state

Convention Keynote Speaker: David Houglum, Ph.D.

The keynote speaker for the 2019 Convention on Saturday, June 22, will be David Houglum, Ph.D. An adjunct assistant professor at the University of Portland, Dr. Houglum will speak about servant leadership, then present a short workshop with a discussion and ques-

tion/answer session.

Dr. Houglum is the director for leadership at the Franz Center for Leadership, Entrepreneurship and Innovation at the University of Portland where he creates educational experiences for students, faculty and staff to serve and lead locally, nationally and globally. He has faculty appointments in the School of Business and

the School of Education at the University of Portland and serves as a leadership instructor and coach.

Additionally, Dr. Houglum is an instructor in Gonzaga University's Master's in Organizational Leadership program where he teaches Foundations of Leadership, Transforming Leadership, Servant Leadership, International and Intercultural Communication, and Introduction to Global Systems to students who are from Fortune 500 companies, the military, collegiate and professional athletic associations, law enforcement, healthcare, education, ministry and the government/public sector. He has led undergraduate students on immersive, global educational experiences to Zambia, the Philippines, Nicaragua, India and New Zealand, focused on some of the most pressing leadership issues of our time such as *See Dr. Houglum Page 10*

Resolutions Committee Members Needed at Convention!

As we gear up for our 44th National Convention that will be held in Portland, Oregon, June 21-23, 2019, Kappas are needed to serve as members of committees that make important decisions regarding resolutions during the convention. Committee members must be present at the convention and be willing to attend the Resolutions Committee meeting on Thursday afternoon, June 20. The National Board will have already reviewed the resolutions and noted their recommendations before each resolution is passed along to the appropriate committee.

The Resolutions Committee consists of a Chair and four additional members, one from each Kappa region, if possible.

During the Resolutions Committee meeting, members:

- process each resolution assigned to this committee
- debate/discuss amendments to each resolution
- make recommendations to adopt the resolution as written, or
- make recommendations to adopt the resolution as amended, or
- make recommendations to reject the resolution.

The Resolutions Committee Chair will then prepare a brief document that relates any debate and the committee vote yielded for each resolution. This information will be presented to the delegates during the National Business Meeting.

If you have never been involved in "official" convention business, this is an easy way to get involved and make a difference in our organization. It does not require advanced preparation, nor a great deal of time to attend the Resolutions Committee meeting, just your thoughtful, active participation. Who knows, this could be your first step toward a future leadership position in Kappa Gamma Pi!

Established in 1985, the Cornaro Scholarship is named for Elena Lucrezia Cornaro Piscopia, the first woman in the world to receive a university degree of any kind.

To be eligible for the scholarship, one must be a member of Kappa Gamma Pi, be a current dues payer and have already been accepted into an accredited graduate or professional program.

One scholarship of \$7,500 will be awarded this year. The application deadline is April 20, 2019.

shall be met for an Officer, Regent or Standing Committee Chair to receive the stipend. The President shall determine whether or not each Officer, Regent or Chair has fulfilled the corresponding duties and responsibilities each preceding fiscal year.

8. Article XI - Dissolution

Whereas: the Kappa Gamma Pi Constitution does not currently include a dissolution clause, and

Whereas: including dissolution language in any organization's constitution is both recommended and encouraged by the legal community because dissolution clauses set out the details of how an organization plans to dissolve or terminate should it become necessary, and

Whereas: inclusion of a dissolution clause is also a prudent action for the organization in 2019 as the number of active Kappa Chapters continues to decline and local members continue to disaffiliate and/or become inactive, therefore be it,

Resolved: that Article XI - Dissolution be added to the Kappa Gamma Pi Constitution.

ARTICLE XI - DISSOLUTION

Section 1.

If the National Board, by a simple majority, decide at any time, on grounds of expense or otherwise, that it is necessary or advisable to dissolve the Organization, it shall call a Special General Meeting (Convention) of the Organization. The National Office shall provide all current dues-paying members written notice of the Special General Meeting and include the date, location and time of the Meeting at least thirty (30) days in advance of the meeting date. Dissolution shall require a two-thirds vote.

Section 2.

The National Board may also submit a Convention Resolution to the delegates assembled at a Biennial Convention if fewer than three local Chapters remain active.

Section 3.

Any assets remaining after the satisfaction of any proper debts and liabilities shall be given or transferred to any charitable organization with similar aims and objectives to Kappa Gamma Pi as determined by the delegates at the Special General Meeting or National Convention.

ranking of schools providing graduates with the most return for the price of their education.

Academics

University of Portland is Oregon's only comprehensive university with schools of business, education, engineering and nursing; a College of Arts and Sciences; and a graduate school. There are more than 40 undergraduate programs and 30 minors, as well as 18 graduate programs, and more than 1,300 courses. UP features small class settings (12:1 student-faculty ratio) and award-winning faculty. German professor Laura McLary was named the 2015 Oregon Professor of the Year by the Carnegie Foundation and Council for Advancement and Support of Education, and the University was one of only 14 schools nationwide to be named a top producer of both student and faculty Fulbright awards in 2015-2016.

The University offers a rich resource for the community through educational opportunities, research and experts, in addition to a host of community offerings such as athletic events, cultural events, speakers and lectures.

Student Life

Believing that education takes place both inside and outside the classroom, UP places a strong emphasis on residential living with 94 percent of freshmen and 57 percent of the total student body living in one of the University's 10 residence halls, including the newest, Dr. Houglum earned a Bachelor of Science degree in psychology from Pacific Lutheran University, and an M.A. in organizational leadership and a Ph.D. in leadership studies from Gonzaga University.

Athletics

The Portland Pilots are members of the West Coast Conference and compete at the NCAA Division 1 level. There are sixteen intercollegiate teams: baseball (M), basketball (MW), cross country (MW), rowing (W), soccer (MW), tennis (MW), indoor and outdoor track and field (MW), and indoor and beach volleyball (W).

Alumni

UP students and alumni are resources for research, internships and full-time employment. More than half of University of Portland's 37,000 alumni reside in the Portland/Vancouver metropolitan area. §

Ad Hoc Constitution Revisions Committee Report

The Kappa Gamma Pi Constitution requires that our members be notified of proposed changes to the Constitution at least 60 days prior to the Convention. We encourage all Kappas to take an active role in making decisions for our organization.

The Kappa Gamma Pi *Ad Hoc* Constitution Revisions Committee met on November 18, 2017, in Toledo, Ohio, to examine and recommend changes to the Kappa Gamma Pi Constitution. The Committee met again by phone conference on May 15, 2018, for an additional discussion of proposed changes.

The Chair was **Susan Smith Jaros** (Lourdes University, OH, '90), and the members were **Kristin Baldeschwiler** (Lourdes University, OH, '03), **Artisha Lawson** (Lourdes University, OH, '14), and **Ed Hosmer** (Madonna University, MI, '02). **Teresa Bosh** (Madonna University, MI, '94) also attended the meetings and offered input throughout the process.

The following summarizes the *Ad Hoc* Committee's proposed changes, which were reviewed by the National Board at its July 2018 meeting in Cincinnati. These recommendations will next be submitted to the Constitution Revisions Committee for their review.

Note: The *Ad Hoc* Committee recommended a number of verbiage changes to make the Constitution easier to read. Explanations for more meaningful changes follow below.

ARTICLES I – IV, IX and X: Unchanged ARTICLE V – ORGANIZATION STRUCTURE

Section 2. b: The committee believes it is important to fill vacancies on the National Board relatively quickly, rather than having months or years pass before filling a vacancy, as has happened in years past. 30 days

puts some pressure on the National Board to act and appoint, rather than wait.

Section 3. b: Language has been added clarifying that the Nominating Committee acts as the elections committee for elections at the National Convention.

Section 6: Language has been added allowing for the formation of affiliate-based chapters. The new affiliate-based chapter language does not conflict with the current geographic-based chapter language. Section 7: The committee revised the verbiage regarding Standing Committees and Convention Committees in parts a and b, respectively. In part a, the Committee recommends removing the College Relations and Development Committees and retaining the Cornaro, LRP, Organization and Personnel Committees. In part b, the committee added language defining the scope of work assigned to each convention committee, including the type of convention resolutions each committee should be assigned to process at convention.

ARTICLE VI - EMPLOYEES

No changes. However, the committee had in depth discussions concerning a possible title change from "Executive Secretary" to "National Executive Director."

ARTICLE VII – MEETINGS

Section 2: The 2023 Convention site, proposed for the Mississippi region, can be included in this document or removed and submitted as a separate resolution at the 2019 Convention.

ARTICLE VIII - FINANCIAL ACTIVITY

The committee looked at merging the II Vice President and Recording Secretary positions into one office. Committee members also considered eliminating the II Vice President position and replacing it with a Standing Committee Chair appointed by the National President. However, in both instances it was felt that the current structure which allows more Kappa members to hold National Board positions is better for the organization instead of making a change that would reduce the number of National Board positions. §
