of Humanities and Communications from Central Michigan University.

She is now the business manager/performer for The Vocal Arts Ensemble of Michigan, an Associate Professor at Northwood University, a Senior Benefit Counselor/Enroller at Benefit Technologies, Licensed Insurance Agent at Worksite Communications, Research and Scholarship at School of Advanced Studies and an adjunct faculty member at Wayne County Community College District. In addition to being a licensed insurance agent, Cynthia is a notary public, member of Script Camp, member of her city's Arts Council and Chamber of Commerce, board member for a small credit union, a Toastmaster, and a member of her local Kiwanis group. She also serves as a Community Ambassador and Reach to Recovery volunteer for The American Cancer Society after her own experience with Stage 4 Breast and Colon Cancer.

Cynthia will be sharing her expertise on our emotional backpacks. We are all carrying backpacks through life that we fill up with "stuff" but we often forget what we are carrying. Emotional backpacks are unresolved emotional issues, traumas and stresses from past and present. Our past emotional experiences influence how we interpret and perceive interactions and relationships today. Cynthia will be going through the following check-in list which you can use to see if you are carrying around some excess baggage that could be impacting your mental health:

- Are you in a state of anxiety?
- Are you feeling sad or blue?
- Are you continually angry and looking for a fight?

Emotional baggage is unique to the person. Unresolved emotions show up in our behaviors. Emotional healing is a process. This lecture will teach us to take inventory of the weight we are carrying and set down the things we no longer need in our backpack.§

National Convention Talk: Rescued & Rewarded

We are fortunate to have Kappa speakers for our upcoming National Convention. One speaker is Elizabeth (Betsy) Shortle (*Ursuline College, OH, '98*) and her talk is on the reward of rescuring animals. Betsy graduated from St. Vincent Charity Hospital School of Nursing in 1975 and received her Bachelor's of Sci-

ence in Nursing from Ursuline College in 1988 where she was inducted to Kappa Gamma Pi and Sigma Theta Tau. She received her Masters of Science in Nursing Administration at the University of Akron in 1995.

She started her professional career at St. Luke's Hospital and worked in medical/surgical and neonatal intensive care. Betsy then worked at the VA Medical Center in Chillicothe, Ohio

for a few years and worked in medical and as a geriatric psychiatry head nurse. She worked as the head nurse on an Adolescent Care unit and was involved in medical, surgical, and psychiatric care at Metropolitan General Hospital. Afterwards she worked at the VA Medical Center in Cleveland and working in multiple capacities including a nurse manager on a 60-bed geriatric psychiatric unit, nursing supervisor on evening/nights, nurse manager on geriatric psychiatric unit, and a nurse educator. Before she retired, she worked for the Department of Veterans Affairs in Washington, DC from 1996 to 2015. She was an education program specialist providing national training for the newly implemented managerial cost accounting (MCA) system. The remaining eight years of her

professional career she was an MCA training supervisor overseeing the education of all staff and national training program for the MCA system.

Personally, Betsy is a mother of two children and volunteered as a Girl Scout Leader, Club Gymnastics

Mom Volunteer, Middle School/High School band mom volunteer, and college athletic team mom volunteer. In 2016, she became a licensed Zumba instructor and taught three to four classes weekly. She started working with KGP as a judge for the Cornaro Scholarship in 2016. She has served as the II VP overseeing the Cornaro Scholarship and is currently the I VP.

2023 Cornaro Scholarship Opportunity

Kappa Gamma Pi is pleased to sponsor the 2023 Cornaro Scholarship. The Cornaro Scholarship was established in 1985. The scholarship is named after Elena Lucrezia Cornaro Piscopia, the first woman in the world to receive a university degree of any kind. Elena Cornaro was a member of a noble Venetian family and received the degree of Doctor of Philosophy in 1678 from the University of Padua, Italy.

This scholarship is exclusive to Kappa Gamma Pi members and allows them the opportunity to advance their academic and professional careers by pursuing a graduate degree or professional program. In order to be eligible for the scholarship, one must be a member of Kappa Gamma Pi, be a current dues payer, and have already been accepted into an accredited graduate or professional program.

The scholarship is competitive and based on the criteria that the applicants demonstrate and embody the Kappa motto: *Faith and Service*. Recipients must also exemplify the values of volunteer work, leadership, academic excellence and well-defined career aspirations.

All Cornaro Scholarship Fund contributions are tax deductible. Your contribution in celebration of a special anniversary, jubilee or in memory of deceased individual is appreciated. A letter acknowledging your gift will be sent to the honoree or to the family of the deceased. Thank you to all who donate to the Cornaro Fund each year. We appreciate your generosity.

Celebrating Sister Barbara Vanos' 25th Jubilee

Sister Barbara A. Vano, OSF is a Detroit native raised in St. Gerard Parish and St. Michael Parish. She earned a Master's in Mathematics at Wayne State University. Sister taught at the Academy of the Sacred Heart. She was a part of a volunteer ministry at Holy Rosary Parish in Houma, LA for a year.

She felt God's call in 1995 when she met the Sylvania Franciscans. Sr Barb entered the Franciscan community of women living out the example of Francis and Clare where prayer, liturgy, and community are the center of their life. Sister served as the Program Director of St. Louis Helping Hands Soup Kitchen while teaching math

and was also a member of the IT Staff at Lourdes University. Sr Barb earned a Master's in Franciscan Studies from St. Bonaventure University in 2003. In 2005, she became the Director of Campus Ministry and Service Learning coordinating various faith, fellowship and local outreach projects. The Christifideles award was presented to Patricia B. Kubistal, Ph.D. (Loyola University, IL, '59). The award is bestowed upon an individual Catholic layperson who has demonstrated by participation in parish life, personal and ministerial renewal called for by the Papal Exhortation, Christifideles Laici, calling the laity to the vocation of responsibility for the Church's life springing from the gift and mission of their baptism.§

Detroit River Cruise

All aboard the Detroit Princess Riverboat! Experience downtown Detroit like never before on the largest dinner riverboat in the Midwest. Enjoy incredible views of the Detroit sunset over the skyline. This vessel has a top cruising speed of 10 mph with an overall length of 222 feet allowing for a total of 1,900 passengers with five decks. There is bar service available on board to purchase cocktails and other beverages. The boat is staffed mostly with Detroit residents who bring local knowledge and charm to each voyage. The Princess has hundreds of cruises each year and has served over a million guests from all over the world. Entertainment on board includes Motown shows, Murder Mystery Dinner Theater, Live Bands, DJ's and more.

The Princess riverboat has an interesting history built in 1993 at the Leevac Shipyard in Louisiana and was originally named the Players Riverboat Casino II.



Merv Griffin ran the boat for years on the Mississippi River in Metropolis, Illinois. Afterward it was purchased by Harrah's Hotel Casinos where it was run as a casino boat out of Lake Charles, Louisiana before being stripped of its gambling décor for a larger vessel. The boat was not operating for a few years and sat in Or-

ange, Texas where the owners had plans to scrap the boat before a buyer from the north stepped in.

In 2004, the riverboat was purchased and started her journey to her home in Detroit. The vessel was too large to fit through northern portions of the Mississippi River and had to be towed around Florida, past Nova Scotia, and through the St. Lawrence Seaway to reach the Great Lakes. The boat had a temporary home in Toledo, Ohio where it spent months being refitted to be able to operate as a restaurant. A full kitchen was added with convention ovens, steam cabinets, moveable heater cabinets, walk in coolers, dish room, and serving kitchens on each level to create the best experience for guests. The Princess set sail in 2005 and has been entertaining Detroit ever since in its current location just downriver from the Hart Plaza. The Princess brought back the boat-style restaurant to Detroit that had been lacking since the late 1980s. The Detroit Princess has filled that void since 2005 and been Detroit's premier riverboat experience ever since.

Kappa has an excursion scheduled for Friday July 21, 2023 during convention.§

The Lady Cornaro

Jane Howard Guernsey is not a Kappa but she is intertwined in our history. She brought to life the story Elena Lucrezia Cornaro Piscipia, who our Cornaro scholarship is named after, through writing of The Lady Cornaro: Pride and Prodigy of Venice. Guernsey

attended Vassar College where she was inspired to write the story of Lady Cornaro from the stained-glass Cornaro Window of Elena in the school's library.

Elena Cornaro came from a rich history descended from three popes, four doges, and a Queen of Cyprus. She was beautiful, brilliant, compassionate, generous, and dedicated to her Catholic faith. She knew four languages and was proficient in mathematics, astronomy, and physics. Elena's academic reputation continued and she was recommended for a degree at the University of Padua. She because the first woman in the world to receive a university doctorate degree in philosophy in 1678 at 30 years old. Elena's health diminished due to "extreme penance" where she wore a hair shirt

and starved herself in a condition called "holy anorexia" until she died at the age of 38. She was buried in Padua in a chapel now called the Cornaro Chapel.

Guernsey's biography is the first study in English of

Elena Cornaro's life and achievements. This was a challenge because during Elena's life time there was little published about women. In addition, none of Elena's own reflections are available because she insisted all her writings be destroyed. Any information

> available is rare and written in Latin or Italian. The Lady Cornaro is a compilation of three decades of research which provides insight into how Elena impacted modern history. Because of Guernsey we are able to see how Elena Cornaro had the resources and drive to become the most educated and celebrated woman of her time. However, she wanted to be the opposite of the indulgence and vanity of the age. Her example to go against the grain has transcends time.

> In the past, Kappa was able to provide copies of The Lady Cornaro: Pride and Prodigy of Venice to the recipients of the Cornaro Scholarship but it is no longer in print. Recently Jane Howard Guernsey passed away and it is only fitting to pay homage to her because so much of

her life was dedicated to preserving the life of Elena Cornaro. Kappa knows about the life of Elena Lucrezia Cornaro Piscipia because of Guernsey and we are grateful for her work. §

KGP affiliates have awarded the Saint Catherine Medal since 1956. Medals may be given on both undergraduate and graduate levels. Institutions may award medals for different schools or divisions.

If your college is not included on this list, please contact the KGP National Office for information. You may sponsor the award at your own alma mater or at any other affiliate. Four Kappas currently sponsor the medal at their alma maters, and KGP sponsors this award at the colleges of deceased KGP National Presidents.

2023 Convention Resolutions and Articles

The delegates assembled at the Kappa Gamma Pi National Convention will process various resolutions during the business meeting in July 2023. Delegates will vote on resolutions that include a memorial resolution, an October service challenge, recognition of service for nine members, and three proposed Constitution and By Laws changes. The three proposed Constitution and By Laws changes involve the frequency of this KGP NEWS publication, lifetime memberships, and dues related to members of religious orders. Each resolution will be processed by various convention committees before the delegates debate (and vote on) each one in the business meeting.

If you plan on attending the convention and would like to be part of a more rewarding convention experience perhaps you might consider participating on a convention committee. It involves about an hour of time to attend a committee meeting Thursday afternoon before Friday's business meeting. If you would like to be on a convention committee simply contact Michelle Chesney in the National Office.

Resolutions that include proposed changes to the Constitution and By Laws are required by Article IX to be posted at least 60 days before the start of the convention. The three proposed changes are:

Motion to Amend Article II - SECTION 4. PUBLICATION

(Reduce NEWS issues from at least 4 issues to at least 2 issues annually)

The Resolution moves to amend ARTICLE III - Section 4. PUBLICATION by striking the word quarterly and replacing it with the word biannually.
